The action learning method supports them in this. - Gaining in their own self esteem and resilient and sharing this with the youth too. Able to support them constant in their self esteem.	3 Hrs

Building trust with youth and within the group and ensure everyone is able/invited to speak up. Having the competences to support youth to connect good and impactful examples to their explanations so that they built bridges with their peers.
