ANOTHER LOOK OF THE CITY

CLIWICE

TYPE OF TOUR: Treasure hunt. Autonomous tour.

PROPOSE: Discover the city with another gaze and collect alternative souvenirs.

TARGET: Families with children between 3 and 12 (but open to everyone).

NEEDS: (every team/family)

- 1 smartphone with camera and app "goosechase"
- Crayons and a block of paper.

narrative line:

-Train (main character). The tour starts in the Main train station from Gliwice. The tour is structured by different stops of this train in which you take a look of specific aspects of the city.

-Frottage: *Frottage* is the technique or process of taking a rubbing from an uneven surface to form a "drawing". In every stop you have to do a scratch (frottage) of an iconic element of the city.

How the tour works:

The tour will be offered physically and in the website of the Gliwice tourist office. (download the app and needs).

After downloading the app, you will find the first clue to start. Taking a photo of this clue, you will unlock the next stop with some information about how to continue. This information will contain a photograph with an already made scratch (frottage), a written clue and an area to go. When you find the next stop you need to do a frottage similar to the photo, take a photo of it, upload it to the app to unlock the next stop. The rest of the tour will continue in the same way.

At the end you will have a collection of scratches from the city as an alternative souvenir.

Digital tools: GooseChase is an online platform that helps you run real-world scavenger hunts. In our case we use it with photographs.

accessibility: Even the tour is focused on families with children between 3-12, it is opened to everyone. The technique is easy to do and the information is accessible. For visually impaired people we offer the possibility to touch the uneven surfaces and to listen to the information.



STOPS AND CLUES

“Welcome to Gliwice! Ready to find all the secrets places to scratch them? You are now in the train station hall. Look around you.

Introduction Gliwice may not be as popular as other cities in Poland, but don't let that fool you. Gliwice is a smaller but beautiful upcoming tourist destination that is worth a visit. You will be surprised by some of the unique things to do and places you can explore at this hidden destination. Gliwice is a city in Upper Silesia, southern Poland, near Katowice. Gliwice is the west district of the Upper Silesian Metropolitan Union – a metropolis with a population of 2 million. The city is located in the Silesian Highlands, on the Kłodnica river. Situated in the Silesian Voivodeship since its formation in 1999, Gliwice was previously in Katowice Voivodeship. Gliwice is one of the cities of a 2.7 million conurbation known as the Katowice urban area and is within the larger Silesian metropolitan area.

1st place: train station

They have to take a photo of the date (1967). With this photo, they will access to the first hint to go the main street. (no scratch at this point).

MOSAIC in the Gliwice station

It was created in 1967 by Zygmunt Lis and Witold Bulik in Gliwice, an industrial city in Silesia, which in 1945 was located within the Polish territory and where the Silesian University of Technology was opened in the same year. The tiles that make up the piece were made in Lysa Góra, a mountainous settlement that features heavily in local legends about witchcraft. It is an abstract composition inspired by industrial landscape evoking connotations of energy, modernity and science.

2nd place: main street

In the main street, we suggest to buy material to scratch the monuments in the library shop next to the first scratch place.

Clue: Under the ground, I flow/run before springing out the surface (1) – first scratch (fountain)

To face me, you need to cross me (2) – second scratch (bridge on plate).

After having done the scratch and have uploaded them on the application, they have other information on the new place where to look.

3rd place: park (lion)

Clue: I'm guarding the palm house since 1830.

Municipal Palm House in the city of Gliwice is the educational venue for popularization of flora and fauna of non-native climatic zones. You can gain information on plants and animals in a much more interesting way than learning from school books.

The Sleeping Lion: the sculpture was made by Gliwickie Zakłady Urządzeń Technicznych SA in 2007. It is a copy of a sculpture cast for Bytom for the Berlin foundry owned by Hermann Gladenbeck in 1873, according to a design by Theodor Kalide. In 1820s, the “Sleeping Lion” sculpture became a symbol of soldiers who died on battlefield and a tribute to their heroism and sacrifice. It was ordered by cities throughout Germany which wanted to commemorate their heroes. Lions were placed in Berlin, Dortmund, but also in Gliwice, Bytom and Legnica. The “Sleeping Lion” of Gliwice was presented in 1849 at a cemetery of soldiers who died in Gliwice hospitals during Napoleonic war.

Theodor Erdmann Kalide was one of the most prominent sculptors of Upper Silesia. He was related to the Royal Iron Foundry in Gliwice. Author of lion sculptures he was born in 1801 in Chorzów. He left for 1819 to Berlin, where he first studied at the Academy of Fine Arts and then continued his own artistic activity. His models were used to cast sculptures which remain today in many cities in Poland and Europe. Gliwice, in addition to the “Vigilant Lion” (ul. Dolnych Wałów, in front of the Caro Villa) and the “Sleeping Lion” (Valenciennes Square near the City Hall), also thank him for the famous “Boy and Swan” (Dessau Square). He was also an author of monuments, including that of Frederic the Great for Wrocław and Friedrich Schiller for Berlin. He died in 1863 in Gliwice, where he spent the last years of his life. He was buried at the Foundry Cemetery.

4th place: totalitarianism monument

Clue: I walk along where people suffered. I am blue, hidden by the trees and on a fence.

5th place: bridge

Clue: I'm representing love.

6th place: park (fountain)

Clue: I'm needed in case of fire.

Skwer Doncaster is a nice garden in Gliwice, Poland The garden itself is more like a city square. With a larger structure in the middle, is filled with exquisite flowering plants and a number of monuments. Every monument here is significant so, go ahead and stroll about, mingle with some local people and understand the interesting stories that surround this garden.

7th place: Piulsuski monument (option)

Clue: I'm the hero of Poland. I have a moustache and a cap.

Monument of Jozefa Pilsudskiego is very important place for many people from Gliwice. The monument is dedicated to Marshal Józef Piłsudski (1867-1935), one of the creators of Polish independence, the chief commander of the Polish Army (1918), the head of state (1918-1922), two-time Prime Minister of Poland (1926-1928 and 1930), the chief architect of foreign and internal policy of the Second Republic.

8th place: main square (gliwice symbol)

Clue: I represent the city and I'm sitting on the ground.

It combines the eagle of Upper Silesia with a tower representing the city. These are the oldest historical arms of the city.

New arms were granted on August 14, 1629 by Emperor Ferdinand II of Austria. These showed the Austrian eagle combined with the eagle of Upper Silesia, with the tower in the middle, with the Emperor's initials on the gate, and above the gate the image of the H. Mary with child. These arms were used until the middle of the 20th century, but different versions were used, as the colours and the shapes were not well defined. The Upper Silesian coat of arms was in use since at least the year 1222 as the document from this year had a seal of Opole–Racibórz Duke Casimir I of Opole featuring a Duke holding a shield with a gothic eagle on it. It is not known whether the coat of arms had different colours from the coats of arms with the eagles of the other Piasts since the colourful iconographic evidence dates back to the 14th century.

The tower represents the All Saints Church

9th place: main square (king plate and fountain)

Clue: The city wants to remember this King on the walls of the city hall.

Clue 2: I gave water to Gliwiczanie and I'm going underground.

Neptune fountain: This sculpture made of sandstone by Johannes Nitsche dates back to 1794. Neptune sculptures were traditionally placed in seaside cities. In the case of Gliwice, the sculpture was placed just after the Kłodnicki Channel, connecting Gliwice via Odra River with the sea, was finished. A partially reconstructed city well from 17th–18th century, discovered during archaeological studies in 2010, is placed next to the fountain.

The Polish plaque

An 1863 Polish plaque at the Town Hall commemorating Polish King John III Sobieski to 200th anniversary of the Battle of Vienna. The king is remembered in Poland as a “hero king”, victor at Vienna who defeated the Ottoman threat.

The artist is Jan Mehlich

10th place: church (wall)

Clue: I'm maintaining the House of God with bricks.

All Saints Church is the oldest sacred building in the city center. The church, first mentioned in 1250 and located in the old town, is a brick building typical of Silesia. It was built as a hall church in the Gothic style. Today's furnishings come from the Baroque period. In 1711 there was a great fire in which the church was partially destroyed. The church tower lost one of its storeys and the Gothic spire. The tower gallery was also damaged.

You arrived to the end of this train trip!





